Daniel's Vision of a Man

- **10** In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia, a revelation was given to Daniel (who was called Belteshazzar). Its message was true and it concerned a great war.[a] The understanding of the message came to him in a vision.
- **2** At that time I, Daniel, mourned for three weeks. **3** I ate no choice food; no meat or wine touched my lips; and I used no lotions at all until the three weeks were over.
- 4 On the twenty-fourth day of the first month, as I was standing on the bank of the great river, the Tigris, 5 I looked up and there before me was a man dressed in linen, with a belt of fine gold from Uphaz around his waist. 6 His body was like topaz, his face like lightning, his eyes like flaming torches, his arms and legs like the gleam of burnished bronze, and his voice like the sound of a multitude.
- **7** I, Daniel, was the only one who saw the vision; those who were with me did not see it, but such terror overwhelmed them that they fled and hid themselves. **8** So I was left alone, gazing at this great vision; I had no strength left, my face turned deathly pale and I was helpless. **9** Then I heard him speaking, and as I listened to him, I fell into a deep sleep, my face to the ground.
- **10** A hand touched me and set me trembling on my hands and knees. **11** He said, "Daniel, you who are highly esteemed, consider carefully the words I am about to speak to you, and stand up, for I have now been sent to you." And when he said this to me, I stood up trembling.
- 12 Then he continued, "Do not be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day that you set your mind to gain understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in response to them. 13 But the prince of the Persian kingdom resisted me twenty-one days. Then Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, because I was detained there with the king of Persia. 14 Now I have come to explain to you what will happen to your people in the future, for the vision concerns a time yet to come."
- **15** While he was saying this to me, I bowed with my face toward the ground and was speechless. **16** Then one who looked like a man[b] touched my lips, and I opened my mouth and began to speak. I said to the one standing before me, "I am overcome with anguish because of the vision, my lord, and I feel very weak. **17** How can I, your servant, talk with you, my lord? My strength is gone and I can hardly breathe."

18 Again the one who looked like a man touched me and gave me strength. **19** "Do not be afraid, you who are highly esteemed," he said. "Peace! Be strong now; be strong."

When he spoke to me, I was strengthened and said, "Speak, my lord, since you have given me strength."

20 So he said, "Do you know why I have come to you? Soon I will return to fight against the prince of Persia, and when I go, the prince of Greece will come; **21** but first I will tell you what is written in the Book of Truth. (No one supports me against them except Michael, your prince.

Daniel chapter 10 gives us a picture of the spiritual warfare that's going on all around us and to which we are mostly oblivious. When we start talking about spiritual warfare people have one of two reactions one is that fear they don't want to think about it or discuss it or they're afraid of what is unseen and of the power of the enemy. The second reaction that I have observed is one of making spiritual warfare weird. They pull out their spiritual formulas, Their spiritual warfare techniques, spiritual maps, identifying principalities and spiritual strongholds and proceed to teach people how they can win at spiritual warfare.

Now, I'm not saying that when used properly there is no value in these things. But Why do we want to make spiritual warfare so complicated and he do we think that so much of the success of spiritual warfare depends on us. If there's one thing I want you notice about the spiritual warfare that is described in Daniel chapter 10 is that the outcome head little to do with Daniel. Yes, Daniel prayed and yes prayer has power. And yes the Angel was dispatched in response to Daniel's prayer. But the battle that is described here is not being fought by Daniel himself But by spiritual beings angels and principalities. In fact, Daniel describes Himself as weak, without strength and totally dependent upon this spiritual being sent from heaven - a posture it would do us well to imitate

The angel supplies Daniel with three main messages in response to his lack of strength

- You are highly esteemed (2x)
- Do not be afraid (2x)
- Peace, be strong, be strong

It seems to me that one of the keys to Spiritual warfare is comprehending these great assurances. Over and over again the scripture is filled with this word of encouragement and strength.
