This morning we continue our quest to re-dig or perhaps dig for the first time wells of spiritual nourishment. As we do we must continue

recognize...

1. The Vital Importance of Fresh Water

The fact is we all need fresh spiritual water to maintain our spiritual lives and growth. We cannot survive off of yesterday's water... We need a fresh supply

appreciate...

2. The Proven Validity of Old Wells

In doing so we must be aware of two threats that may prevent us from drawing fresh spiritual water from those wells

- Wells that have been stopped up and rendered ineffective by the enemy. The enemy knows the importance of these old wells and seeks to keep us from benefiting for their nourishing supply.
- Spiritual practices that have been neglected, forgotten, never passed on and thus never understood.

3. The required Necessity of Work

Maintaining open wells takes work. Drawing water from those wells takes work.

The means of getting the water (The Bucket) is not near as important as the Well itself. There may be new methods of drawing the water and that is ok.

So far we've discussed in detail two important wells

- 1. The Well of The Word of God
- 2. The Well of Prayer and Intimacy with God

This morning let's talk about a third well...

The Well of Fellowship with other believers

Hebrews 10:19-25 English Standard Version (ESV)

How do we dig, re-dig or maintain this well

1 Find a GOOD Church

One of the enemies we face with this well, is how we define the word church. For many it means nothing more than a place, a structure a building. It's programs, and services, ministries and equipment, it days and times

But the fact is WE are the church.

the *ekklesia* is the community of believers who have been "called out" of the world to belong to King Jesus. It is never identified with a building but always with the people. The church may meet in a building, but it is not the building, the home; the church is the people (e.g., Phlm 2- "The church in your house"; Col 4:15 - The Church in her house). The true church is the visible expression of the expanding Kingdom of God. The church is the community of believers who meet together, regularly and irregularly, to love one another, care for one another, carry one another's burdens, stir up one another to love and good works, confess their sins to one another

I believe we need a fundamental shift in how we think about the mission of the church. Let me illustrate, using three types of ships.

Some Christians see church as a cruise liner, offering Christian luxuries for the whole family—sports, entertainment, childcare services, and business networking. They show up at church asking only, "Can this church improve my religious quality of life? Does it have good family ministry facilities? Does the pastor preach funny, timeconscious messages that meet my felt needs? Do I like the music?"

If their church ever ceases to cater to their preferences ... well, there are plenty of other cruise ships in the harbor. In fact, often they get involved with three or four of them at once. After all, the music is great on Cruise Liner A, and the kids enjoy the youth program at Cruise Liner B, and we do most of our fellowship and Bible study with friends at Cruise Liner C, and we occasionally podcast the angry young pastor down the road who tells the funny stories. - J.D. Greear <u>Gaining by Losing: Why the Future Belongs to Churches that Send.</u>

So what makes a GOOD Church?

- One that is faithful to the entire Word of God
- One that is fulfilling the Mission that Jesus Gave
 Matthew 28:19 English Standard Version (ESV)
 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in[a] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,
- One in which the presence and power of the Holy Spirit is evident
- One that has not compromised with the teachings of the world Revelation chapter 2 speaks of the churches in Pergamum and Thyatira as having compromised themselves with the teachings of the world (practices described as

the practices and teachings of Baalam, The Nicolations and Jezebel - Sexual Immorality and Eating of food sacrificed to Idols

2. Quit waiting for Perfection

This has implications on 2 different levels...

- Some people think they have to be perfect in order to attend church. But if you are waiting for this you will never belong to a church. The church is the place where we can learn to be more like Jesus. It is where our imperfections can become known and overcome. It is where we om to understand what we should be striving for
- Some people are looking for a PERFECT Church. There are no perfect churches. Only ones that are striving to be what God has called them to be and who will make mistakes and will fail at times, but who know how to stay humble and responsive to the correction and leading of the Holy Spirit.

3. Be Faithful, Loyal and Forgive

Hebrews seems to indicate that the benefits of being a part of the church are made available as we remain faithful to the concept of gathering together.

There are times and good reasons for leaving a church, but there is so much to be gained by learning to resist the urge to constantly church hop. Like the plant that is often uprooted and transplanted into different soil, so is the spiritual life of one who constantly changes churches

This will take forgiveness, a well we will talk more about later in this series.

4. Participate and Serve
